The Issue:

- Larger and more frequent storms
- Too much water and too many pollutants entering our waterways





When is Stormwater a Problem?

- Urban stormwater can cause flooding and water quality problems
 - Hard/impervious surfaces rooftops, parking lots, roads and driveways - water can't soak in






When is Stormwater a Problem?


 Stormwater can carry pollutants into storm drains, which takes them directly into our creeks, the Thames River and, eventually, to Lake Erie
















Glen Cairn Park North improvements and community events
