The Upper Thames River Conservation Authority (UTRCA) has completed a review of the Project Plan, Embro Dam Class Environmental Assessment, regarding Embro Dam, located within the Embro Conservation Area at 843970 Road 84, Lot 15, Concession 4, Township of Zorra, Oxford County (Lat. 43°10'09" N, Long. 80°54'55" W).

As a result of comments received during the comment period after issuance of the Notice of Completion of Project Plan on July 18, 2024, particularly in response to comments from the Ontario Ministry of Environment, Conservation and Parks and Ontario Ministry of Citizenship and Multiculturalism, changes to the Project Plan have been made to address issues of concern.
