Westminster Ponds / Pond Mills ESA - Master Plan Implementation





Pre-European: Area was attractive to First Nation People

1793: First written reference to the area

1812: Settlement began in Westminster Township

1878: Earliest reference to the area having natural significance in the Atlas of Middlesex County



1913: Earliest attempt to protect the area when W E Saunders purchased land near Saunders Pond

Around the same time, the Western Ontario Fish and Game Protective Association purchased and protected land around Fish and Game Pond

1915: Railway line established through area to connect commuters from London to Port Stanley.



1943: Land was secured (expropriated) for a major military health campus for veterans returning from war

1961: Land became part of the City of London through annexation of Westminster Township.




1971: City council passed a resolution to preserve the Westminster Ponds area through the work of many citizen groups

1977 – 1985: Land acquisition program was undertaken to acquire property in this area

Transfer of lands from the Federal government to the Victoria Hospital Corporation

Several technical studies were initiated in the early 1980's



1988: The area was designated as an ESA

1990: An agreement between the UTRCA and the City of London was signed

1995 – 1999: Several studies conducted by LHSC to identify appropriate land use





2000: Initiation of an update to the Master Plan

UTRCA retained in 2002 to coordinate Master Plan Update.

LAC was comprised by a 21 member group of dedicated individuals.

These individuals:

helped develop the mission statement,

6 guiding principles, 6 goals and 23 objectives, and 86 final recommendations

2005: Master Plan Update was completed.

The City of London, the UTRCA, and community partners will preserve the ecological integrity of Westminster Ponds / Pond Mills Environmentally Significant Area while providing compatible educational and recreational opportunities.





Master Plan Implementation



2006:

- Established and began monitoring of groundwater well at Pond Mills
- Finalized land transfer from LHSC
- Removed LHSC fence around Saunders Pond
- Installed new rotary boardwalk
- Removed old "T" boardwalk and replaced
- Replaced education dock at north pond
- Naturalized area off Southdale between Fish and Game and Dearness
- Completed trail monitoring
- Improved main access points at Southdale and Adelaide (Rotary) and at South Pond (Ducks Unlimited)

Finalized all access points


